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1. Why Gender Equality & Climate Adaptation

 Gender Inequality is linked to vulnerability and risk

 Having inequality will be exacerbated by the impact of Climate Change

 Gender inequality restrains the effectiveness of mitigation and adaptation strategy if gender relations are not considered



2. Impact of Climate Change on Cambodian Women

Why does CC hit women harder?

- Women make up a majority of the poor
- Women work in sectors most affected
- Women are primary caretakers of children & house holds.
- Women have less access to & advantage over resources, services, and decision making
- Existing gender inequality



3. MoWA's Gender & CC Committee

- Coordinate & Cooperate with other institutions, NGOs, PDWA, and so on in area of mainstreaming gender into CC in National Policies & development programs.
- Coordinate & distribute gender mainstreaming media in programs & MoWA's departments
- Do capacity building for working groups & MoWA's staffs.
- Research the impact of CC or disaster on W,M, & Children
- Organize education campaign on Gender & CC
- Examine, follow up, & evaluate Gender implementation
 & CC aspects of the programs.

4. Gender & Climate Adaptation Activity: Cambodia's NAPA Follow Up

- Gender Action Plan (GAP) was finalized and implemented after the conduct of gender rapid assessments
- Gender & CC training manual was consulted with MoWA gender CC team
- Using Gender & CC training manual for teaching working groups and communities (Kratie & Preah Vihea provinces)
