In 2010, MOWA as a member of National Climate Change Committee (NCCC).

MOWA/Climate Change Committee established in 2011

- * Policy and programme dialogue with gender perspective
- ° Capacity building and Public awareness
- ° Explore activities/initiatives

Example: CCA and gender initiatives (1)

- Two provinces for off-farm activities for women economic empowerment in 2010
 - Support women and community when their land was flooding or no rain including food security
 - Empowerment of women
 - Decrease migration
- In 2012, we expands 5 provinces more to explore non land based activities

Example: CCA and gender initiatives (2)

Selected two provinces in 2010

Improve the utilization of climatic information of vulnerable and women

Access to water resources for household use

Access to climate resilient farming practices and crop varieties and Access to extension services on climate change.

- In 2011, Gender Action Plan (GAP) developed and and used for sectors (land management, water and agriculture)
 - A Gender Action Plan (GAP) had been budgeted in 2011 and implemented from 2012 onwards.
 - Integration into ministries' master plan (sectoral plan)

- Gender responsive approach should be included at the early stage of the project/programmes design.
- Include the gender related responsibilities in the terms of reference of the project staff and all key players
- Gender Research –specific climate change impact is needed for policy and programmes designers
- Explore off farm activities and/or non land based activities.
